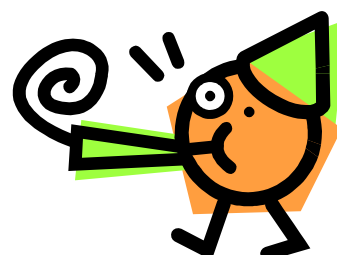

- **PE Robert** remarked how he liked the GREAT fellowship at the DC. By attending the conference, a Rotarian can get a sense of the size of Rotary and its International nature. **John Lawrence**, D3400's Zone RI Director, told the attendees that "**Rotary is Back**," meaning that **The Rotary Foundation (TRF)** has money to implement projects again. **DGE Al Purwa** told the District that he needs to increase the **District Dues to Rp. 20,000 per month per member**. Unfortunately, this is needed because the District currently has a **Rp. 66 million deficit**. Lastly, PE Robert said next year - RI wants Clubs to be **Bigger, Better, & Bolder**.

- **SE Barb** told the members that this was her FIRST time to Surabaya and hadn't realized it was Indonesia's 2nd largest city. It has beautiful wide streets and many multi-level western-styled shopping malls ! All very impressive – especially all the shopping that was available.

The DC was held at Hotel Bumi (formerly the Hyatt) which was a perfect venue for this type of conference. It not only had a large ballroom for the opening ceremony, but it also had many meeting rooms for the big variety of 'breakout' sessions. One very interesting session was the **ShelterBox workshop**. The presenter had setup a tent which is included in the box and displayed all the various pieces of equipment that are included in each box. ## Malaria – Preventable & Curable by Dr. Claus Bogh



In 2007, malaria killed more people worldwide than HIV/AIDS (about 3 million people), with the majority of the deaths occurring in children less than five years of age. Unlike AIDS, malaria can be prevented and cured.

The 'Sumba Foundation' expanded its project in 2008 to cover hundreds of villages and to thousands of more people. However as it expanded, the Foundation still had to maintain, diagnose and treat those that were now under its aid umbrella. Funding them was crucial to the long-term sustainability of the Foundation's work.

Sumba has one of the highest occurrences of malaria in Asia. To address this urgent problem, in 2004 the Sumba Foundation retained a world-renowned malaria expert, **Dr. Claus Bogh**, to develop our malaria and health programs.

An estimated 20% of all children die or become severely brain damaged by malaria before the age of 10. Based on our clinical surveys of targeted villages, 62% of the children below the age of 5 and 30% of the total population had malaria. That number has now been drastically reduced by 85% in the children living in the villages that are covered in Phase 1 of our Malaria Control Program.



Phase 1 of our comprehensive Malaria Control Program started in 2004 and covered 603 people in 6 villages. In 2007, our Phase 2 expansion reached 6,000 people living in 121 villages within a 45 square km area. At least 60 children's lives have been saved since the start of the program.
