MEET the CLUB'S LATEST MEMBER – Rtn. Simon Dunn

Simon Dunn was born in 1968, in a small town named Traralgon, of 30,000, in rural Victoria, 2 hours drive from Melbourne, Australia. His father is an Industrial Chemist, managing a chemical laboratory at a large Electricity generating power station. His mother, a housewife, is a part-time manager at a local cinema.

By the time Simon was 8, he lived with his family on 6 acres of land out of town. It was then that he was given his first motorbike. He upgraded twice by the time he was 15, and by this time, was motor cross racing and worrying his parents. He also purchased his first car at 15 yrs., and by 17, had learned to rebuild it, and repainted it. Also at age 15, he took his first job at McDonalds to support his passion for cars and motorbikes. He also assisted McDonalds to build their first yearly financial budget at the age of 16, and continued to do so for the next 10 years. Simon loved accounting, but also mechanics, so he decided to follow accounting as a career, and cars, bikes, mechanical and other car stuff as a hobby.

Simon completed a part-time university degree from 18 yrs old while working in various accounting / HR / personnel roles for the Government owned company that owned five Electricity power stations, with 17,000 employees, and the supplier of around 20% of Australians total electricity demand.

For the next 16 years Simon moved up through the ranks in the power station industry, mainly on computer program development teams, and Accounting and Financial roles. Throughout this time he continued his passion for cars, and built and rebuilt cars, engines, repainted cars, drag races, and built show cars to feed his hobby. In total he owned around 14 cars over a space of 15 years, as well as diversifying into other businesses on a part-time basis.

Simon's father moved to Paiton, East Java in 1997 working as the Industrial Chemical Manager for a large foreign owned power station. Simon then started doing regular trips to Java via Bali, and fell in love with Indonesia. In 2001 he had a job offer in Bali, and decided to leave the power station industry after a 17-year career and relocate to Bali. Nine years later, he is still here...

He met and fell in love with a lovely Balinese girl by the name of Ika in 2002, and married in 2003. Putu Bianca was born in 2004, and Made Chloe in 2006. Ika works in the hotel Industry in Sales and Marketing.

Currently, Simon is the Financial Controller of a Management company with a few projects on the go. His hobbies are Formula 1 car racing, all other motor sports, and teaching his young girls about mathematics. Maybe one day, one of them, will follow in his footsteps.

Yayasan Membina Api Cinta Kasih (YAMACK) by PP Robin Dougherty



Our very own [PP Robin](#) was last week's Guest Speaker. She took this opportunity to inform the Club Members about what the **Yayasan Membina Api Cinta Kasih (YAMACK)** is currently doing and the MAJOR PROJECT it is undertaking at the moment.



The YAMACK, a non-profit organization based in Bali, was founded in 1998 by a diverse collection of individuals. The Board is actively concerned with finding solutions to environmental, social and educational problems and challenges.

Current Programs sponsored by the YAMACK are the **Pupuan Kindergarten Redevelopment and Library; Village Rubbish re-cycling; and the Sunrise School in Kerobokan.**

The Major Project that YAMACK would like to complete in the near future is the **Matahari Terbit Center Building** to be located on the campus of the **Sunrise School in Kerobokan.** Their goal is to provide **children with physical disabilities** with a proven method of therapy, improving motor skills and increasing independence in many aspects of daily life. Classes will consist of small groups (5 to 10) of children with scheduled time lots of 30-40 children each week. Most of the children will be from the targeted area of Bali. Children accepted into the program would be **Free-of-charge.**

The School would consist of a Main classroom (50 sqm), Healing Room, Toilet and shower facilities, Administration area, Staff quarters, Preparation Rooms, Wheelchair storage area, and a Therapeutic Pool.

The plans include making the school as **Green as possible**, i. e. using natural and sustainable building materials, solar energy panels, and an environmentally friendly wastewater system. Educationally speaking, a holistic-style therapy that encompasses the needs of the child will be employed. This type of therapy is appropriate for all children with mobility and motor related disabilities. In addition, physiotherapy, speech therapy, occupational therapy would be utilized as methods to help individual students. The center will also provide alternative therapies such as Acupuncture, Reiki and Craniosacral therapy.

The center will offer the type of therapies that are in place internationally. The center will also provide therapy technique training for Indonesian staff. A qualified Instructor will ensure that the Indonesian staff will receive 'on-the-job' training in therapy and programming techniques. The center will also have a range of Voluntary Professionals such as speech therapists, etc.
