## THE BALIFOKUS FOUNDATION by Ms Yuyun Ismawati

many years, she has been known as a respected advocate and a solid voice for making Bali (Seminyak/Oberoi/Petitenget areas) a cleaner place to live. Yuyun was recently awarded a scholarship to Oxford University to pursue a Ph.D. in Environmental Engineering.



Yuyun began her career as an environmental engineer working with consultant firms to design rural and city water supply systems. Seeing that her skills were not serving the poor communities, most in need of safe water and waste management, she made a career change.



In 1996, she decided to work with a local NGO regarding environmental issues. In June 2000, Yuyun founded the BALIFOKUS Foundation with several friends. Their initial FOCUS was to develop and then implement urban environmental programs, with an emphasis on basic services for the poor and sustainable tourism towards a toxics-free future.

Through the BALIFOKUS Foundation she has redirected her environmental engineering expertise to assist poor communities in designing safe and well-coordinated waste management initiatives, while prioritizing environmental health and economic benefits for local people. She works with local communities in urban slums, small-medium entrepreneurs, local governments and tourism industry to implement a better and sustainable waste management.

In concluding her talk, she said there are three main issues that Bali needs to address in the near future, i.e. **Waste Collection/Chemical Awareness/Water Usage**.

**Waste Collection:** The Govt. currently only collects 60% of the waste produced in Bali today. The other 40% is collected by private firms. There is only one landfill operational – which unfortunately is open - causing a large emission of greenhouse gases. Govt. regulations are unclear and not enforced at the local municipal levels.

**Chemical Awareness: Issues:** In general, community members have a poor awareness on product knowledge, e. g. most healthcare workers do not know that when a thermometer breaks, the mercury vaporizes and stays in the environment from six months to a year. Mercury is highly toxic to humans.

**Water Usage:** In 2000, about 73% of Bali's water resources were for domestic/ tourism/ agriculture. In 2006, this has increased to the critical level of 85%. SOLUTIONS are needed IMMEDIATELY.

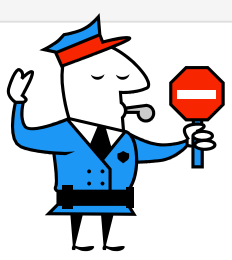
