

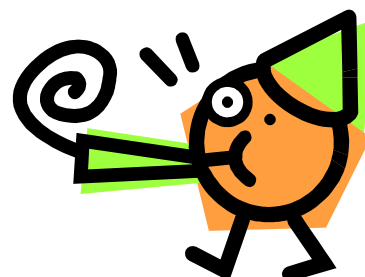

## Meet the Club's Newest Member



Johana (Thomas) Heath (Chinese name - Shan Shan Tseng ) was born on July 15, 1974 in a very small village in Kalimantan (Borneo), Indonesia. She is the second of four children. During her childhood, she remembers moving every two years from one jungle village to another because her Father was building Churches. She is very grateful for these experiences, because this trained her to be very 'adaptable' and 'respect' Mother Nature.

After 10 years of living in Kalimantan, her parents sent her to Taiwan to study. There she did her formal studies and began to understand the Chinese culture better. In addition, she learned about a high-tech modern society/ lifestyle. She graduated from Fu-Jen college in Taiwan majoring in fashion marketing. During her summer vacations, she worked for a music record company. This is where she learned her selling and marketing skills. This training helped her understand how to sell merchandise to customers with a sincere sense of humor.

After college, she got a job in a toy company in the USA. She was sent to their branch office in San Diego, CA. She was also responsible for visiting their factory in Tijuana, Mexico from time-to-time. With this new experience, she was able to learn Spanish, got to know many Latin people - their culture, food, songs and dance. She loved it ALL. However, she was only in San Diego for six months, because she had an opportunity to continue her studies in New York City, NY, USA.

Johana tried to complete her MS degree, but unfortunately was unable to do it. However, during her two-year stay in NY, she worked part time for a diamond jewelry company. This, along with a number of other interesting experiences, opened her eyes and gave her a new view on life.

She moved back to Taiwan six months before 9/11. There, she worked for a cosmetic packaging company doing international marketing for them. During this time, she had the opportunity to attend a number of exhibitions in Europe, China, and Japan. This wonderful experience helped expand her marketing skills and knowledge about Asia. She also had the opportunity to be involved in media and advertisement.

In January 2005, a business trip in Bali would change her life completely and be the reason why she is living in Bali today. She met her future handsome husband to be - Ashley Heath, fell in LOVE and eventually got happily married. Ashley loves surfing and has been here in Bali for 12 years. They have a beautiful, lively three-year old son, who is their best gift from God. Since being together, they have built two villas and are currently in the vacation rental business. They have also obtained the Indonesia distribution rights for Smart Candles – a company that supplies electronic candles to hotels, villas, spas and restaurants.

She believes that by joining the RC of Bali Seminyak, she will have a good opportunity to help many needy people here in Bali.

## 'Bumi Sehat Foundation International' by PP Mark Savage



**Ibu Robin Lim** (left) from the **Yayasan Bumi Sehat** (Healthy Mother Earth Foundation), unfortunately was unable to attend our Club meeting because she is currently in the US doing some 'serious' fundraising for her new CLINIC in Ubud.

However, **PP Mark** (below), her No. 1 FAN, gave the members a brief background on this legendary woman who started a **Safe Birthing Method Clinic in Ubud** in 1995.

Yayasan Bumi Sehat is a non-profit, village-based organization of dedicated families, midwives, doctors, nurses, teachers and volunteers from Indonesia and other countries around the world. Bumi Sehat runs Two "by-donations only" Community Health Centers (Bali and Aceh, Indonesia) that provide over **17,000 health consultations** for both children and adults per year.

Midwifery services, to ensure gentle births, are at the heart of Bumi Sehat and their clinics welcome approximately 600 new babies into the world each year. They have also established capacity building and community outreach programs, including a Youth Center and village recycling programs.

Currently Bumi Sehat Foundation International is now seeking funding of **US\$ 850,000** to build new premises in Ubud. To date, they have raised **US\$ 250,000** towards their TARGET.

Once Ibu Robin has returned from the USA, PP Mark will invite her to come to our Club and give us an UPDATE about her project and explain HOW the RCBS can possibly help her achieve her GOAL of a new facility.

At the conclusion of PP Mark's informative talk, **PP Anita** mentioned that the RCBS had previously donated **US\$ 8,000** (in conjunction with a Rotary Club in Florida, USA) to Ibu Robin for her Clinic in Aceh (Tsunami Disaster). Lastly, it was noted that the Bumi Sehat Foundation International is the ONLY one of its kind still actively working in Aceh. For further information, please visit the following link:
