

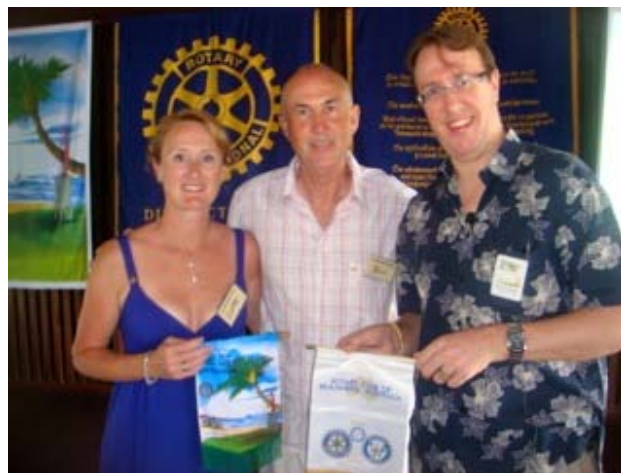

'The View from Bali's Tourism Merry-go-round' by John (Jack) Daniels



PE Patrick introduced the Guest Speaker, Jack Daniels, who is known far-and-wide in Indonesia. Jack is the Owner/Manger of **Bali Discovery Tours** and the Editor of '**Bali Update**' - the island's most circulated weekly newsletter on tourism. Jack is the recipient of both the national '**Adi Karya Pariwisata Award**' and Bali's '**Karyakarana Pariwisata Award**' - respectively, the highest national and provincial recognitions for service to tourism.

In addition to his Tourism work for many years, Jack has also been very involved with Rotary. In the early and mid 1980's, he was the first expatriate and at the time the **youngest President of an Indonesian Rotary Club – RC Kuningan**. In addition, during that time, he also received the very prestigious "**Service Above Self**" Award from the D3400 District Governor.

Jack started his very informative talk by informing the members that he would not be TELLING them anything, but instead posing some interesting questions about the future of Tourism here in Bali.

First of all he shared with the Club **Indonesia's Report Card for 2009:**

- Arrivals increased 0.4% (6.40m)
- Total Spending down 12.3% (\$995.9 m)
- Av. Length of Stay down 10.3% (7.69 days)
- Av. Spending US\$995.93 (Down 15.49%)
- Total Forex US\$6.4 Bn (Down 12.3%)

Then he looked at Challenges that are facing Tourism TODAY –

- World Economic Downturn
- H1N1 Epidemic
- Tourism security concerns
- Political Situation



He then asked his first Question ?

How do you define a competitive circle for Indonesian tourism?

And some observations from Jack:

- ASEAN arrivals increased 48%
- R.I. arrivals increased 24%
- R.I. lost 16.33% market share
- Only Myanmar and Brunei (?) performed worse than R.I.
- Within ASEAN Indonesia is losing ground as it is being consistently outperformed

Following a brief explanation regarding ASEAN, he turned his attention to Bali.

During the next 20 minutes, Jack outlined some of the 'concerns' that need to be addressed sooner rather than later – concerning the 'sustainability' of Tourism in Bali:

'Carrying Capacity: Population'

- 20% increase in last 10 year = 3.9 mn.
- Uncounted Expatriate Population
- Subak + Banjar System Under Threat
- Is Bali's next generation culturally disenfranchised?
- The coming cultural clash – Inevitable?



'Bali's International Airport'

- Runway Length
- Limits to Length
- Passenger Growth
- Unseen vulnerabilities
- Access roads
- Go north?

'Power to the People'

- Current 560-590 MW grid
- 50,000 Families Waiting
- 9,000 requests for more power.
- 780 MW from Celukan Bawang in 2012?



'Bali's Water Crisis'

- Bali's Water Deficit
 - 1995 - 1.5 bn cubic meters
 - 2000 – 7.5 bn cubic meters
 - 2015 – 27 bn cubic meters
- Subsidence + Sink Holes
- 4 Polluted River
- 6 Polluted Beaches

Wrapping up his talk, Jack gave the members some 'encouraging words:'

'Points of Hope'

- Indonesia's Current Political Evolution
- Balinese Cultural Awakening
- Education + Global Information
- Non-Government Organizations

Jack finished his lively / thought provoking talk by **THANKING / APPLAUDING** all the Rotarians in Bali for making a **DIFFERENCE** and being committed to Rotary International's motto:

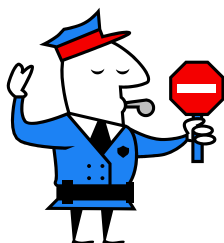
