

'The SMILE FOUNDATION of BALI'

Before our SPECIAL Guest Speaker **Mary Northmore-Aziz** began her talk, **President Robert** presented her with a cheque for **IDR 100 million** from the **Rotary Club of Bali Seminyak** (left).

IDR 50 million was raised by the **Hard Rock Hotel** (Rock 'n Run 5 km Charity Fun Run event) and **IDR 50 million** was raised by **Rtn. Detlev** through his weekly Sunday brunches hosted at his home.

The Smile Foundation of Bali (Yayasan Senyum) is a non-profit organisation in Bali that helps people with **craniofacial disabilities obtain health care**. Senyum means smile in Indonesian and Yayasan means 'foundation' or 'institute.' The Smile Foundation facilitates operations for **cleft lip and palate and other craniofacial deformities**, due to birth defects, accidents, or tumours.

Mary Northmore-Aziz (right) founded the Smile Foundation of Bali in 2005 at the suggestion of **Professor David J. David** from the **Australian Craniofacial Unit** to identify those in need of craniofacial surgery. Professor David J. David has continued his association as the chief adviser to the foundation.

In December 2006, the Foundation opened the '**Smile Shop**' in Ubud. It provides a source of income for the Foundation through the sale of second-hand goods and old stock from local businesses.

After extensive fundraising, '**Smile House**' was opened in January, 2007, in Denpasar. The Smile House provides accommodation and educational facilities, in particular for those from outlying areas. Much of the funding comes from donations from both individuals and organizations. Our very own RCBS **Rtn. Detlev Hauth** has raised over **IDR 160 million**, to date, through fundraising at his now VERY famous, weekly Sunday Lunches.



Mary's presentation was based on their **2010 Annual Report** and it was interesting to note the following points:

Since its foundation five years ago the total number of patients coming to the Yayasan for assistance was in excess of 725 patients.

In 2010 alone, the Yayasan assisted 24 craniofacial patients including:

- 156 cleft lip operations
- 39 cleft palate operations
- 36 craniofacial (non cleft) operations done in Bali
- 3 more serious craniofacial (non-cleft) operations done in Australian Craniofacial Unit (ACFU)
- 7 other operations such as accident trauma, bone-graft reconstruction, chemotherapies.

Professor David J David and his team of ACFU Adelaide Australia have been coming to Bali for over 30 years developing healthcare for craniofacial patients. In 2010, Professor David and his team visited twice. Working with the local surgeons of Bedah RSUP Sanglah, two craniofacial clinics were held. Yayasan Senyum Bali is the organizer of these two clinics that includes organizing the patient logistics, patient recalls system, and patient medical record database as well as patient operation should the surgeons decided to do local surgeries on patients with cases that can serve knowledge sharing between Professor David & team and the local surgeons.

Achievements:

- Outreach Project – Buleleng/Singaraja
- The SMILE Bus Project – through great response from generous friends and supporters, by the end of May 2010, sufficient funds had been raised to enable the Yayasan to purchase a mini bus to take patients to and/or from harbor or airport to the Smile House or hospitals and to transport medical teams and also to pick up donations around Bali.
- Craniofacial Training – Adelaide - With the help of a grant from **The Smile Train America**, Yayasan Senyum Bali has facilitated two medical personnel from RSUP Sanglah Denpasar to ACFU Adelaide in June 2010. Dr Agus Roy Rusly Hariantana Hamid, SpBP a plastic surgeon and Dr. I Wayan Nirvana, M. Kes, SpBS, a neurosurgeon, learned about ACFU facilities and procedures at firsthand, and attended some craniofacial operations there.
- Speech Therapy Program - In 2010, as a result of a Smile Train grant, the Yayasan started a speech therapy program for cleft palate patients based at the Smile House and managed by the Yayasan staff. Working with a speech therapist from RSUP Sanglah Denpasar, this program has been running well. Since it was started in October 2010, total of five patients have had therapy and their speech has improved.

Fundraising Events:

- BAVISCH – Charity Concert. The director of **BAVISCH** - Bali Violin School & Orchestra, Bapak Anam held a charity concert on 9 October 2010 at the Bali Padma Hotel Legian.
- Bali International Women Association (BIWA) Bazaar
- Commonwealth Tennis Gala Dinner – The Commonwealth Bank International Tennis Tournament, held a fundraiser at the Grand Hyatt Bali. This year a generous amount was raised through an auction during the tournament Gala Dinner on 6 November 2010 at **Grand Hyatt Bali Nusa Dua**.
- Carols by Candlelight@BIKU was held on 21December 2010 at **BIKU Restaurant**.

Smile House:

In February 2010, the Yayasan moved into their new building located on Jln. Pulau Aru No. 9, Sanglah, Denpasar. Smile House was donated to the Yayasan by a long-time and generous supporter from Holland. There are 10-patient bedrooms and an in-house staff room.

The Smile Shop in Ubud continues to generate good income for the Foundation, however the ones in Sanur/Denpasar have not achieved the same results.

Mary reported that all their financial records for 2010 had been completed and audited and to date all the financials were finalized. For further information, please visit the Smile Foundation's website: <http://www.senyumbali.org/>
